### CURRENCY AND CREDIT CARDS

The "Baht" is the currency of Thailand and is based on the decimal system. One Baht is subdivided into 100 Satang. Coins consist of 25 Satang, 50 Satang, 1 Baht, 2 Baht 5 Baht and 10 Baht. Note denominations are 20 Baht, 50 Baht, 100 Baht, 500 Baht and 1,000 Baht. Current (July 2015) exchange rate: 1 USD = 32 Thai Baht, 1 Euro = 36 Thai Baht. Foreign bank notes and traveler's checks can be converted into Thai Baht at the hotel, foreign exchange banks and other authorized money exchange outlets. The exchange rate is subject to market fluctuations. Most major credit cards are accepted in hotels, shops and restaurants. VISA and MasterCard are accepted at the congress registration desk. Personal or company cheques are not accepted at the registration desk.

### TIPPING

Restaurant prices usually include service charge but a reward for good services is always appreciated.

### TIME

Thailand is seven hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+7). Thailand does not observe daylight savings.

### EMERGENCY

Dial 191 for ambulance, rescue services, fire department and police.

### BUSINESS & BANKING HOURS & ATM

Regular businesses operate on a 5-day week, usually from 08.00 to 17.00 hours. Many stores open seven days a week from 10.00 to 22.00 hours. Government offices are open between 08.30 to 16.30 hours with a 12.00 to 13.00 hours lunch break, Monday to Friday, except on public holidays. Banks are open Monday to Friday from 08.30 to 15.30 hours except on public holidays.

Most banks have branches at major shopping centers such as the Central World Shopping Complex for currency exchange. They are open daily between 11:00–20:00 hours.

ATM machines with international withdrawal capacity are widely available.

Major credit cards such as VISA, MasterCard and American Express are also well accepted.

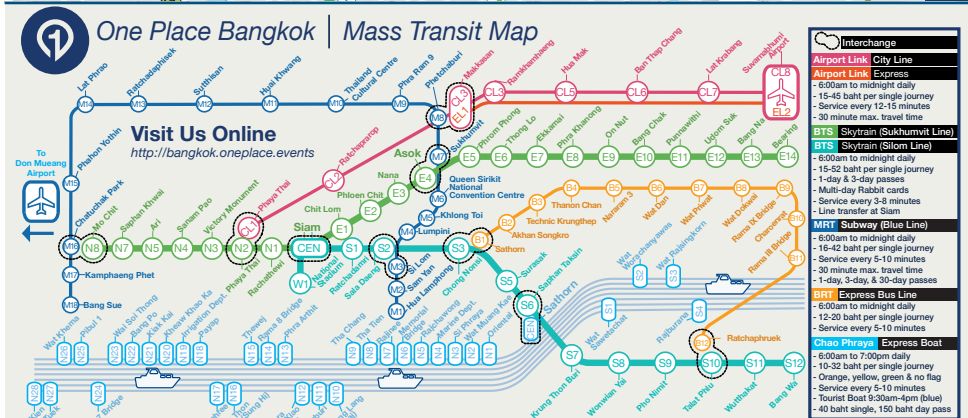

Depart for transfer to Ayutthaya, famous for its ancient temple ruins, and today a UNESCO World Heritage site. Ayutthaya was Thailand's capital from the 13th to the 17th century, when the city was attacked, conquered and occupied for seven months. Prior to the mid-13th century Ayutthaya was an outpost of the Khmer Empire, and the temples dating from the 10th to the 13th centuries are deeply influenced by the Khmer style. Temples constructed after the Khmer period have a noticeably different, more natively 'Thai' look.
